

# JESUS CLUB INFORMATION

## FOR STUDENTS

### **Student Responsibilities:**

Build a student leadership team around a vision of reaching every student on your campus with the Good News of Jesus. Simply put, find other students to join you in launching your club!

### **Core Actions**

- a) Find a teacher sponsor
- b) Get the club approved by your school faculty
- c) Secure a meeting location for weekly Jesus Club gatherings
- d) Contact Onevoice (the creator of Jesus Clubs) and let us know you're starting a club
- e) Brainstorm creative ways to promote the bible club meetings, as well as the other activities that will be taking place.
- f) Live and love like Jesus on your campus

### **What is a Jesus Club?**

A Jesus club is a student-lead, high school Bible club that gathers together 1- 2x each week within the school day (during lunches or free periods). The goal of Jesus club is to create a safe environment for all students to gather and engage with the topic of faith. Jesus club is different from the traditional Christian club in that it is open to all students regardless of their person belief or spiritual backgrounds. Jesus Club is the student club for those who desire to know more about God but do not feel comfortable going to a Christian club gathering or local church. It's the Bible club "for everyone else."

### **What can I expect to see at my school?**

Jesus Club student leaders often request the assistance of a community sponsor. These sponsors are background-checked, young adults and Christian faith leaders who commit to support student efforts. Sponsors regularly drop off pizza and donuts for students, the day of club. According to the Department of Education student rights, at the discretion of the principal, students will gather during lunch time, on a weekly basis, for their Jesus Club gatherings. These gatherings are usually held in the school theater, gym, or club advisor's classroom. Youth professionals and community sponsors are regularly invited by the student leaders to act as guest speakers for these weekly club gatherings.
